TIME WELL SPENT - GLASGOW TO INCHCAILLOCH

- 08.43** Train departs Glasgow Queen Street for Balloch. Download the [walking guide to Inchcailloch](#) and have a read on the journey.
- 09.33** Train arrives in Balloch. Plenty of time to explore local businesses on your way up to Balloch Bus Station.
- 09.59** Catch the 309 to Balmaha from Balloch Bus Station (Stop 1). Enjoy the views of Conic Hill as you approach Balmaha.
- 10.20** Bus arrives in Balmaha. Grab a hot drink from the coffee shop on the main street before you set sail.
- 10.35** Feeling energised? Time to head down to Balmaha Boatyard to get your tickets.
- 10.55** Boat departs for Inchcailloch.
- 11.00** Arrive at Inchcailloch - that didn't take long, did it? Head to the summit for stunning views over Loch Lomond, and find out about the intriguing island history [here](#).
- 13.00** Time to catch the boat back to Balmaha.
- 13.05** All that exploring worked up an appetite? Enjoy lunch at the local pub.
- 14.00** Still got energy to burn? Head round the [Millenium Forest Trail](#) for more magnificent views.
- 15.00** Hop on the bus back to Balloch. Time to rest those feet and share your adventure. Make sure you tag us **#AJourneyThatMatters**.
- 15.21** Bus arrives in Balloch. Pop back down the road to the train station.
- 15.38** Train departs for Glasgow.
- 16.25** Arrive back in Glasgow, back in time and fully refreshed for whatever the night holds for you. It's the perfect day out when you can kick back, relax and let public transport do the work - that's **#AJourneyThatMatters**.
